

Transfer your super to a KiwiSaver account

Are you moving permanently or indefinitely to New Zealand? You can use this form to apply to transfer your super from your Media Super account to a New Zealand KiwiSaver account.

How to transfer your super to a KiwiSaver account

You can transfer your super to a KiwiSaver account in just four simple steps:

1. Check your eligibility
2. Complete the *Application to transfer your super to a KiwiSaver account* and attach:
 - a. certified proof of your identity
 - b. proof of your New Zealand residence
3. Provide a statutory declaration stating you've permanently emigrated to New Zealand – using either the attached Australian or New Zealand statutory declaration form
4. Return your forms and documents to:

Make sure you complete all mandatory fields (*), and that you have received all outstanding contributions, otherwise we won't be able to process your request. Visit ato.gov.au for more information on transfers to a KiwiSaver scheme.

Checking your eligibility

To be able to transfer your super to your KiwiSaver account you must:

- have a KiwiSaver account in your name
- check your KiwiSaver scheme will accept your Australian super (not all schemes accept transfers from Australia)
- have emigrated permanently to New Zealand
- transfer all of the money in your Media Super account (partial transfers aren't allowed).

Providing proof of your identity

To prove your identity, you need to provide a certified copy of your:

- current driver's licence, or
- current passport.

How to certify documents

To certify a document, you must take the original document and the photocopy to an authorised person. If your identification is double-sided, make sure you copy both sides. The authorised person must:

- write in English on the photocopies: 'This is a true and correct copy of the original' and
- write their name, occupation and registration number (if applicable) and sign and date each page.

Important: Certified photocopies need to be clear and legible. We can't accept certified documents that have been faxed or photocopied, or those certified on the reverse side of a photocopied document.

Who can certify an original document outside of Australia?

The following people are authorised to certify your documents:

- Australian Consular Officer or Australian Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the *Consular Fees Act 1955*)
- judge of a court in an overseas jurisdiction
- notary public, including those exercising functions outside of Australia
- police officer of an overseas force
- Registrar, or Deputy Registrar, of a court in an overseas jurisdiction.

We also need evidence of the certifier's status. For example, if the certifier is a police officer, we need details of their police badge number.

Providing proof of your New Zealand residence

If the document you've used to prove your identity (i.e. your driver's licence or passport) doesn't have your current address in New Zealand on it, you'll need to provide an additional document that proves your address. This could include a utility bill, a council rate notice or bank statements.

Providing your statutory declaration

You must provide an Australian or New Zealand statutory declaration stating you have permanently emigrated to New Zealand.

Different rules apply for Australian and New Zealand statutory declarations – refer to the relevant statutory declaration form attached for details.

- *Certified copy of your proof of identity document
- *Australian or New Zealand Statutory Declaration stating you have permanently emigrated to New Zealand
- *Proof of your New Zealand residence (e.g utility bill, council rates, etc)

Step 5: Sign and date the authorisation

By signing this request form I confirm:

- I have read this form and the information completed is true and correct.
- I am aware I may ask for information about any fees or charges that may apply, or any other information about the effect this transfer may have on my benefits, including my insurance, and have obtained or do not require any further information.
- I discharge the Fund and its Trustee of all further liability in respect of the benefits paid and transferred to my New Zealand fund.
- I request and consent to the transfer of superannuation as described above and authorise the superannuation provider of each fund to give effect to this transfer.
- The Fund and its Trustee will be released from all claims, liabilities and obligations in respect of my interest in the Fund and any insurance cover will stop from the date that the benefit is transferred to my KiwiSaver Account.
- I wish to transfer my entire benefit to my KiwiSaver Account.
